Enrollment at Michigan State College by Decades from 1855 to the present.

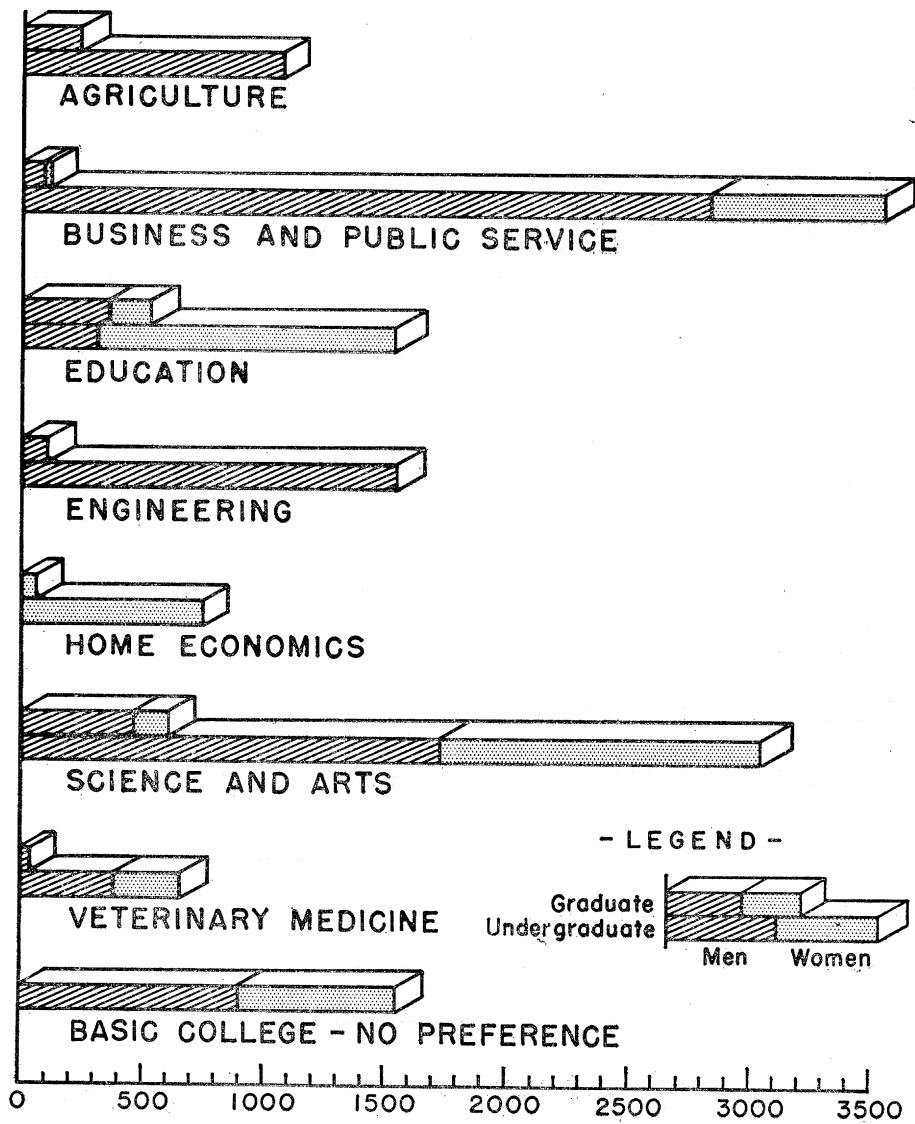

Geographical Distribution of Michigan Students by Counties for Fall Term 1953.

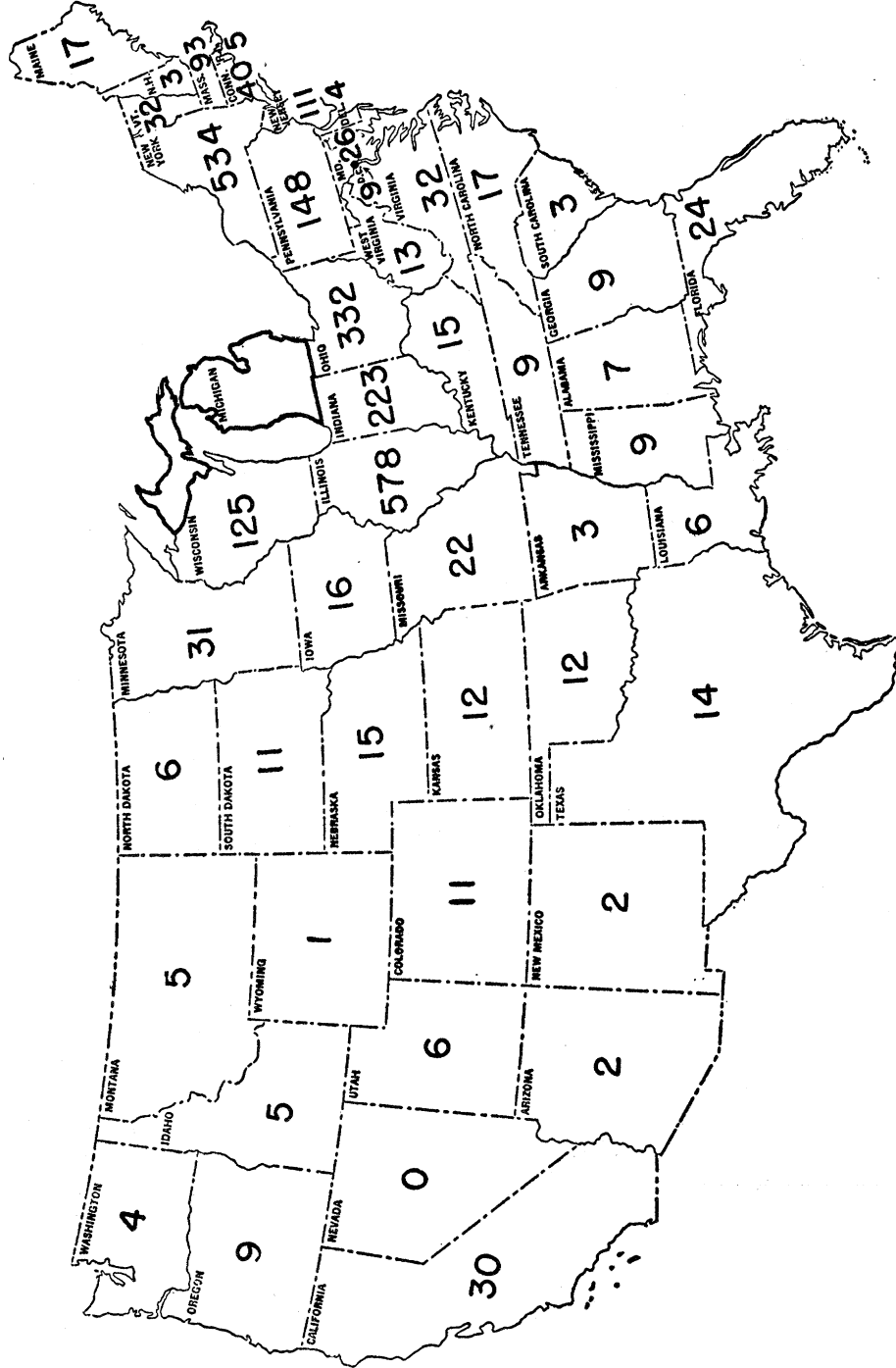

Geographical Distribution of Out-of-State Students by States for Fall Term 1953.

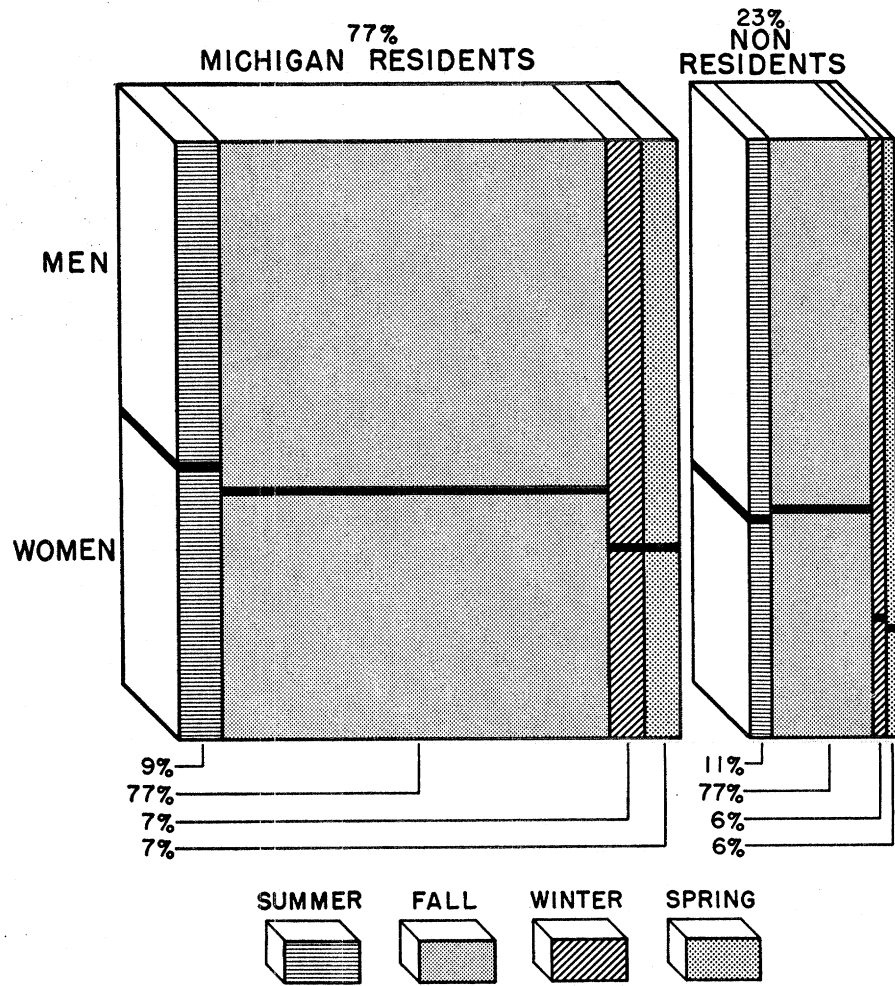

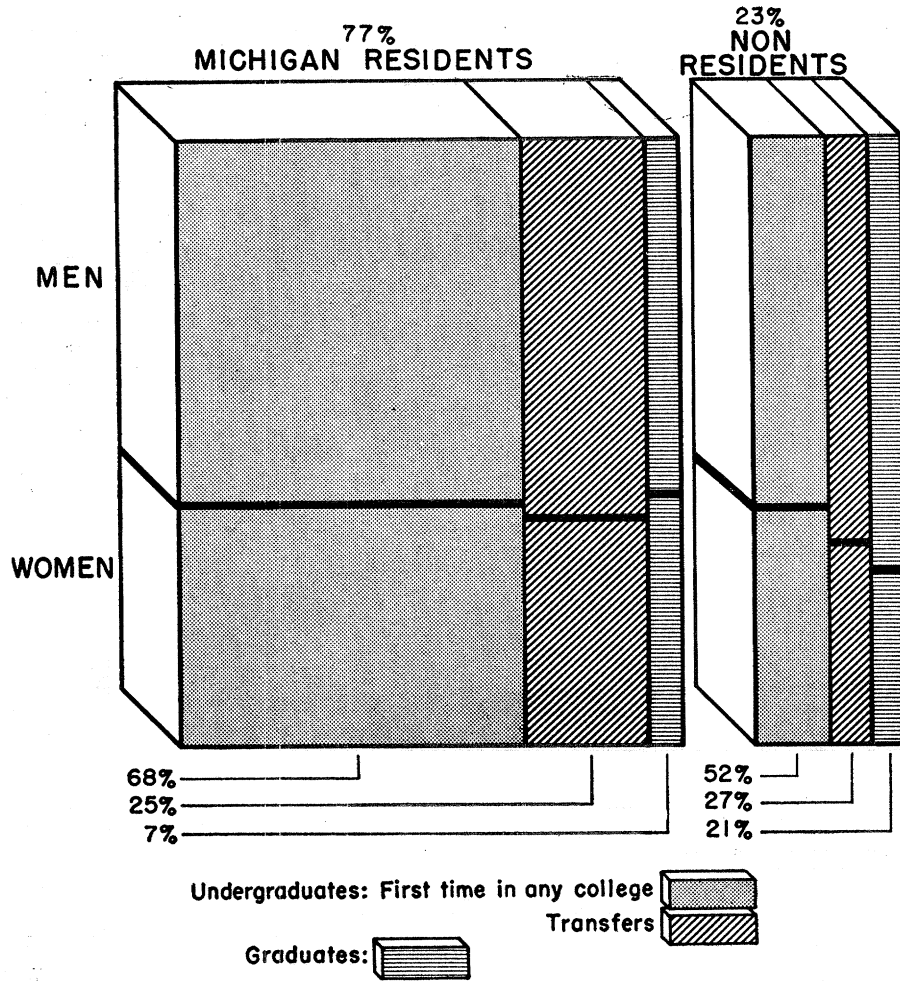

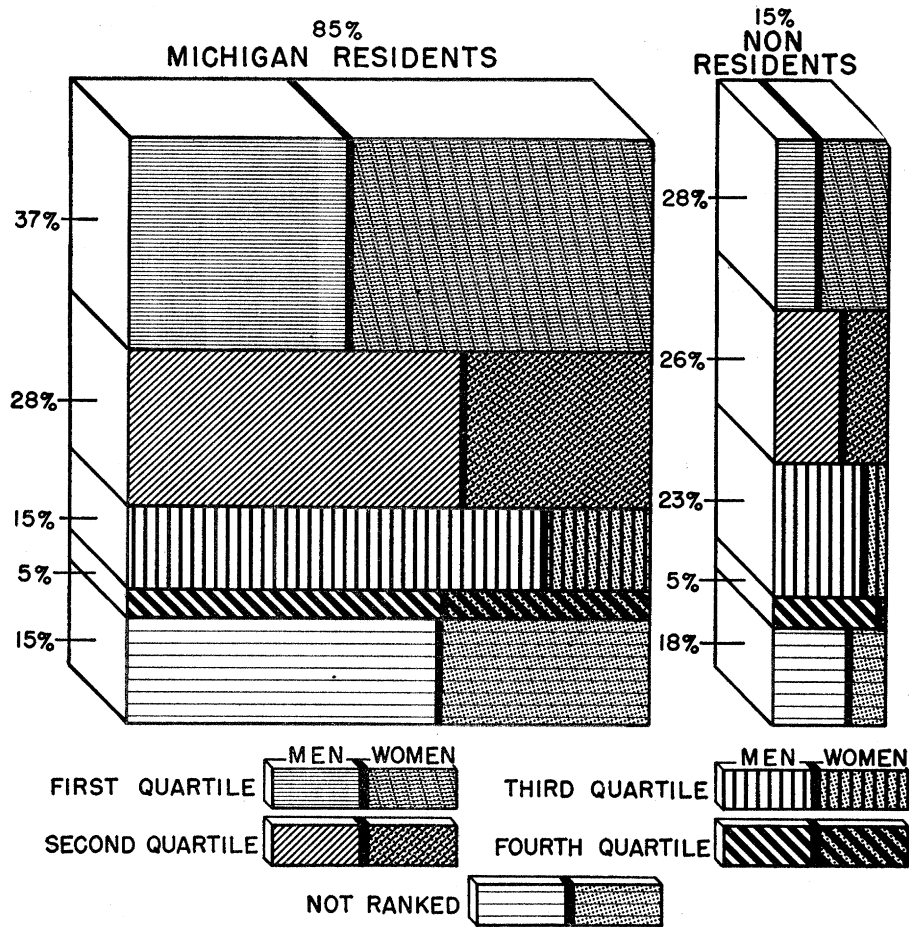


CHART IIIc

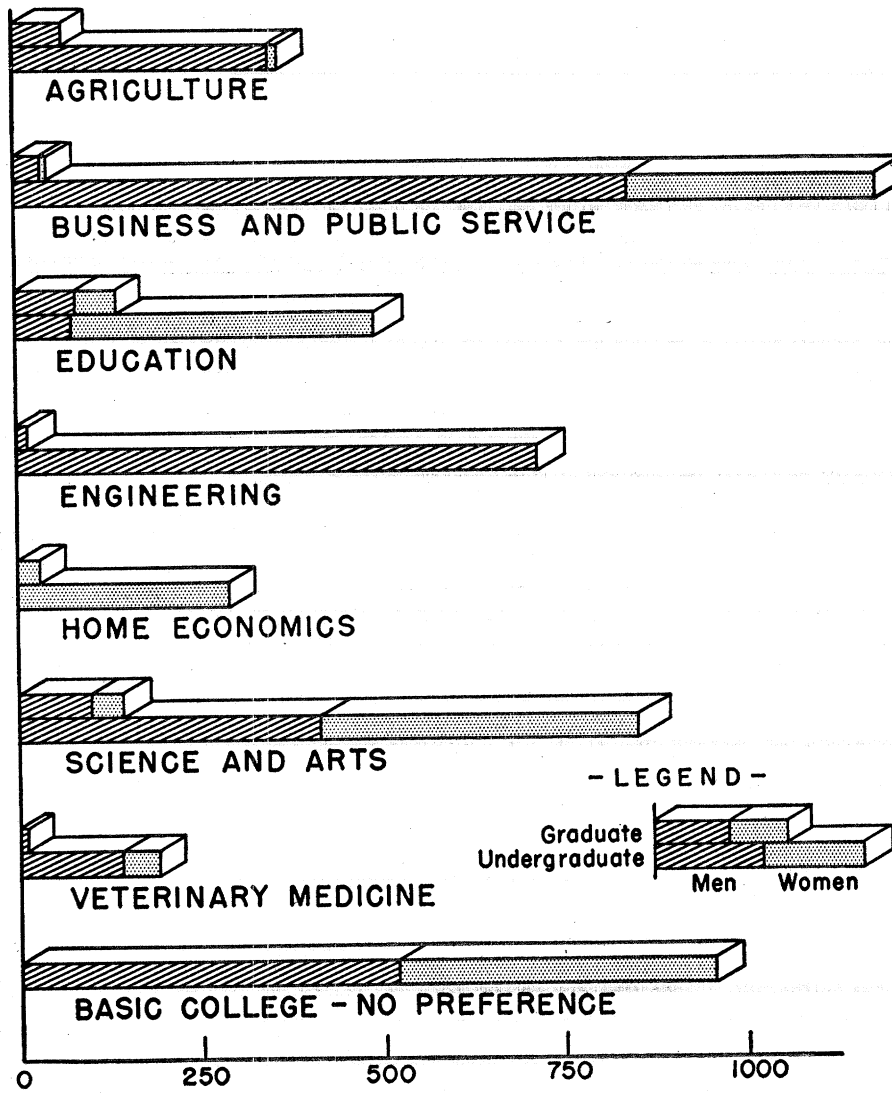

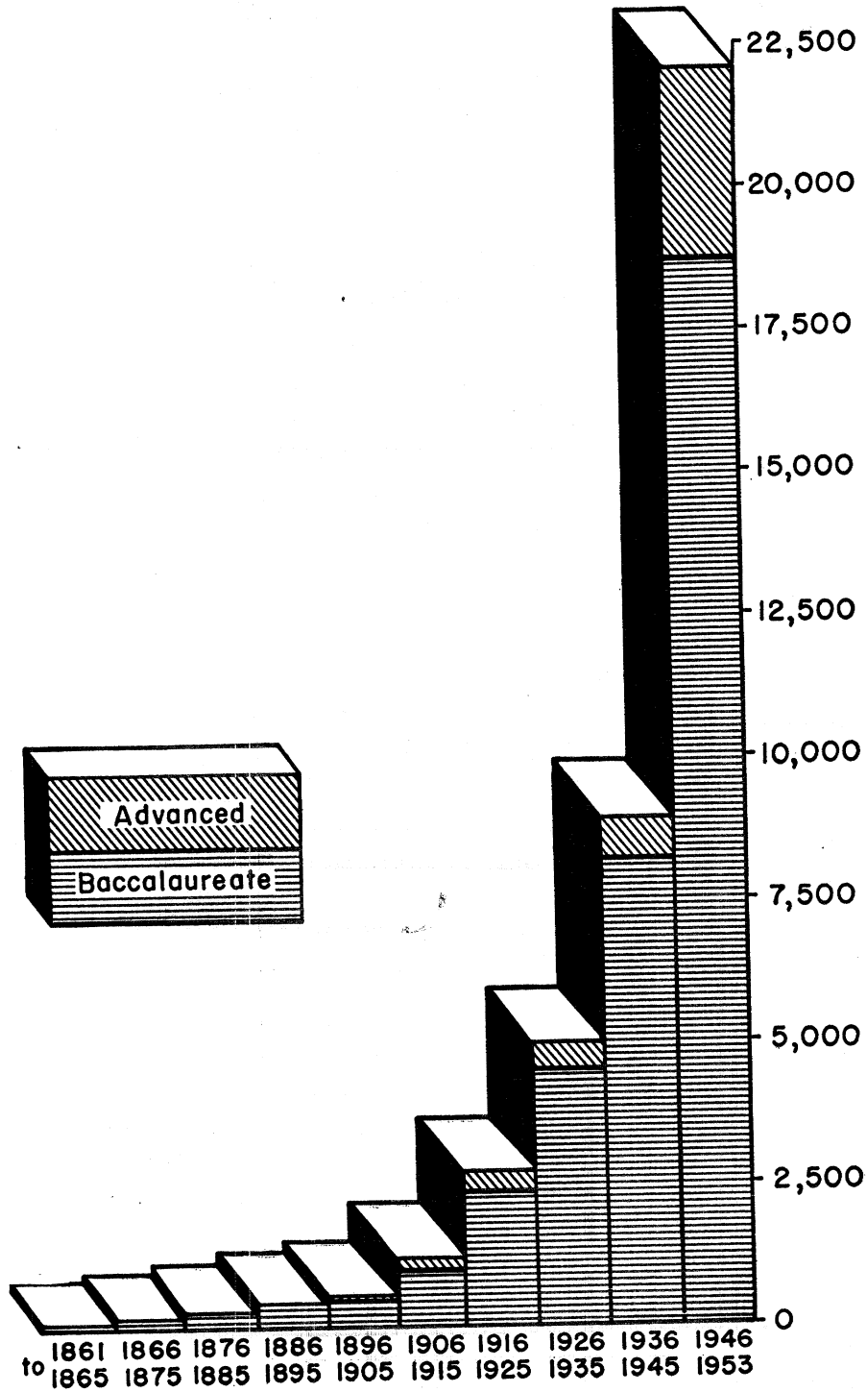

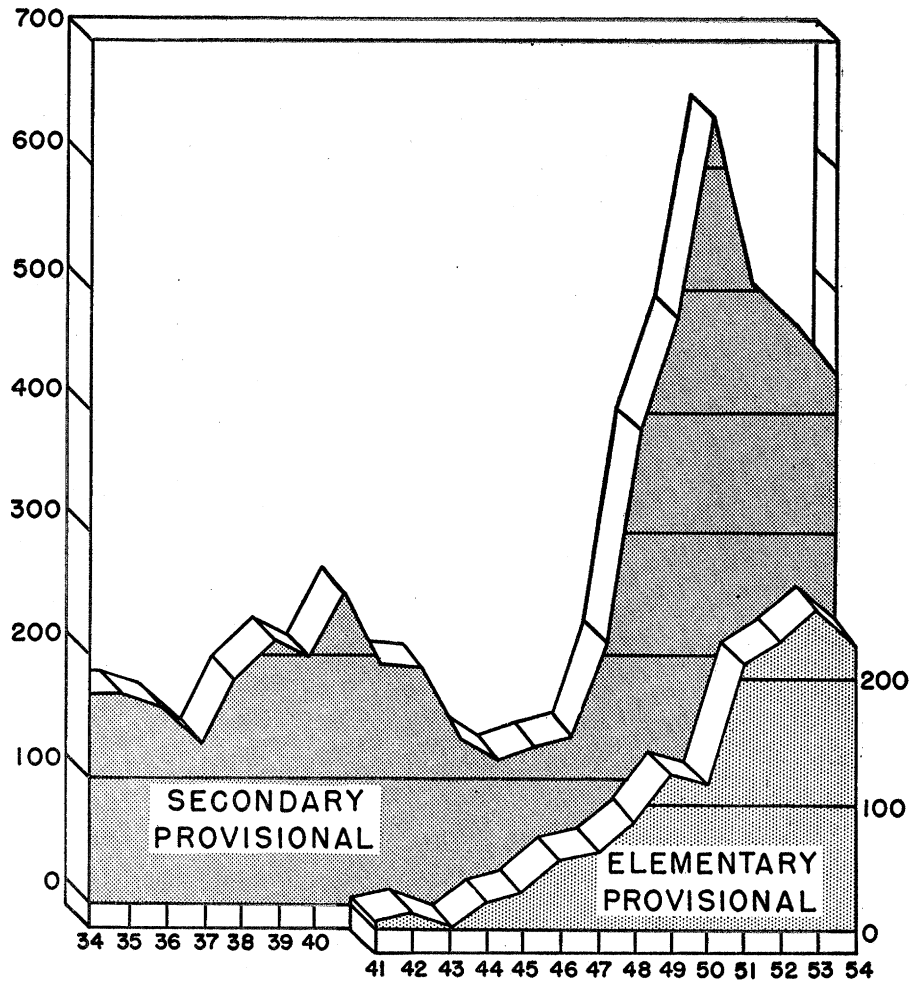
