

PART II

TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENTS

This part deals with the enrollment of all students at Michigan State. Chart IIa shows the numerical growth of the student body to the present time. The projection of student enrollment to 1970 is an estimate based on:

- (1) the past records of student enrollments at M.S.U. in comparison to the total college age population and (2) the anticipated size of college age population.

An interesting point is that student enrollment since 1875 has approximately doubled every decade.

Chart IIb is a comparison of the enrollments of the colleges for the year.

The tables that follow show student enrollments for the year, for each term, the distribution by curriculum and by geographical distribution.

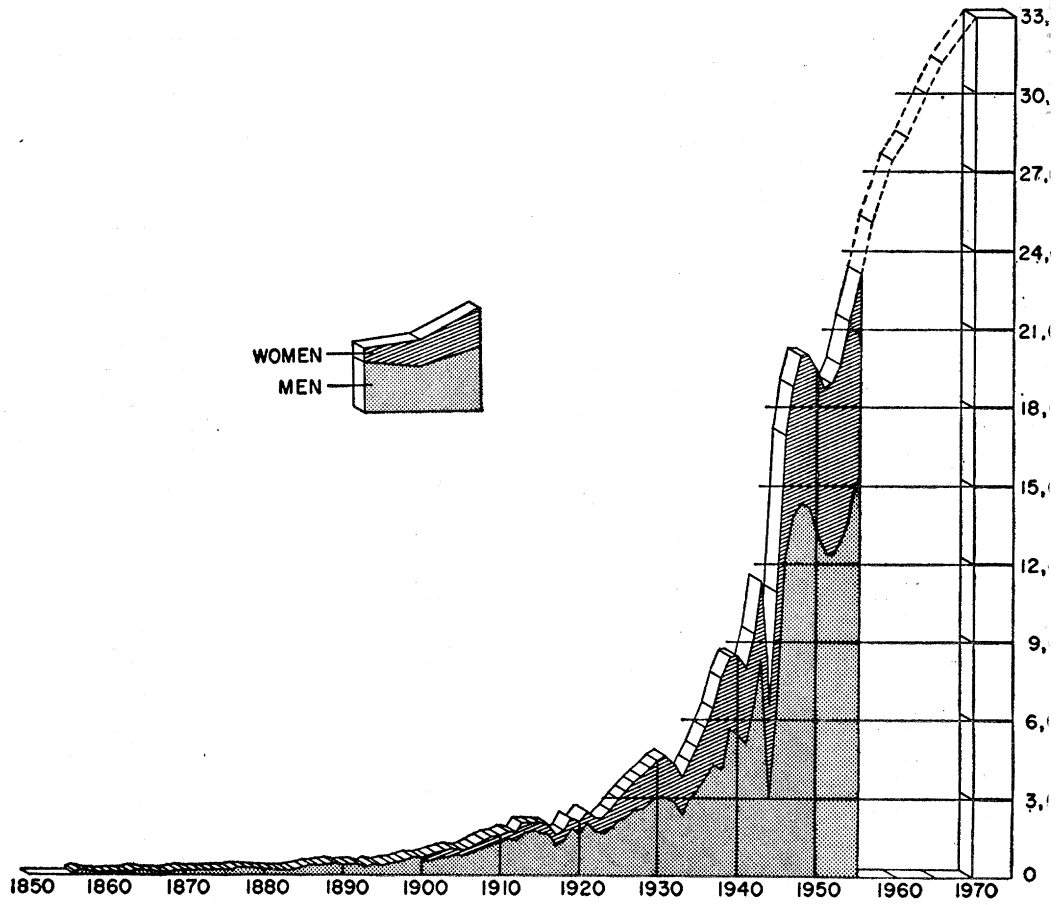

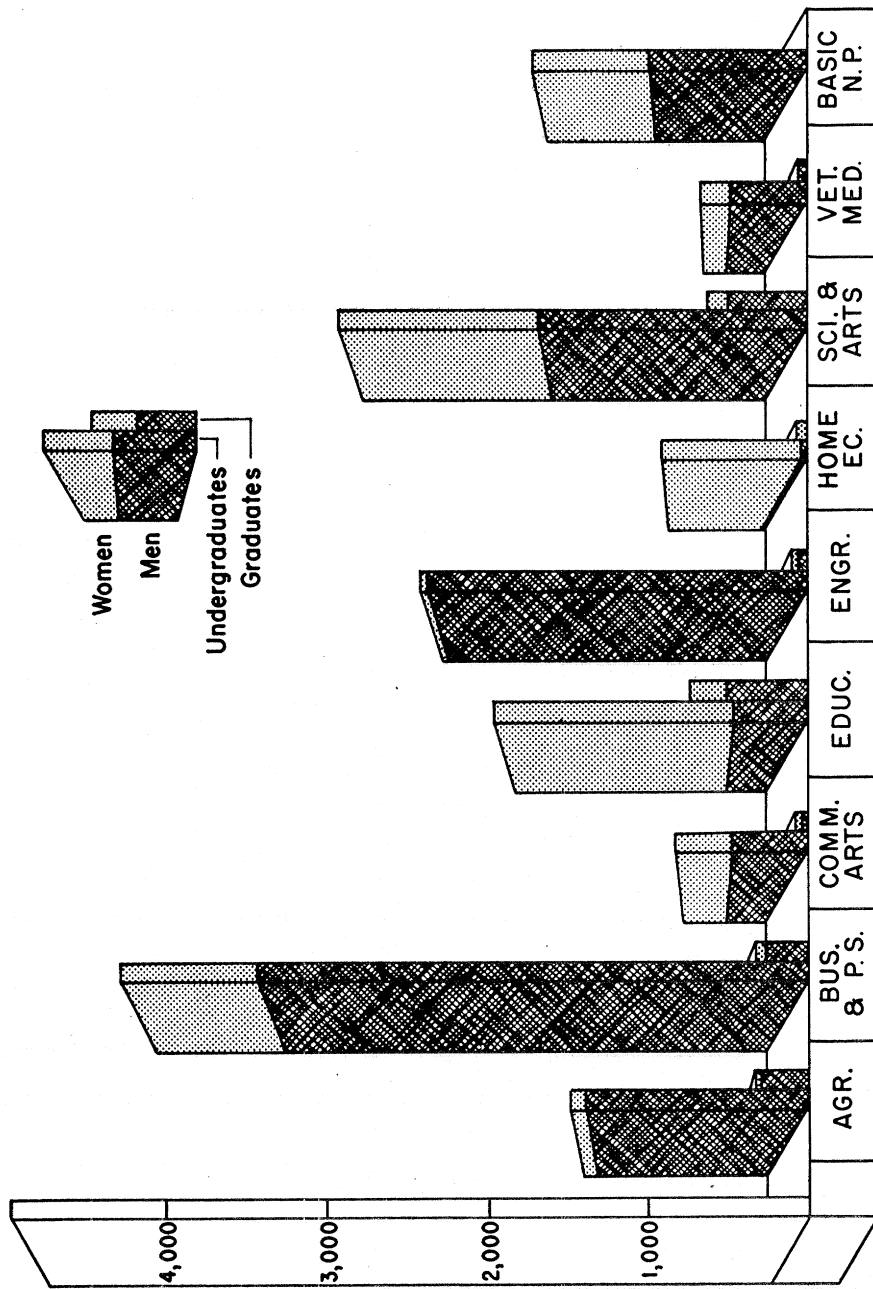

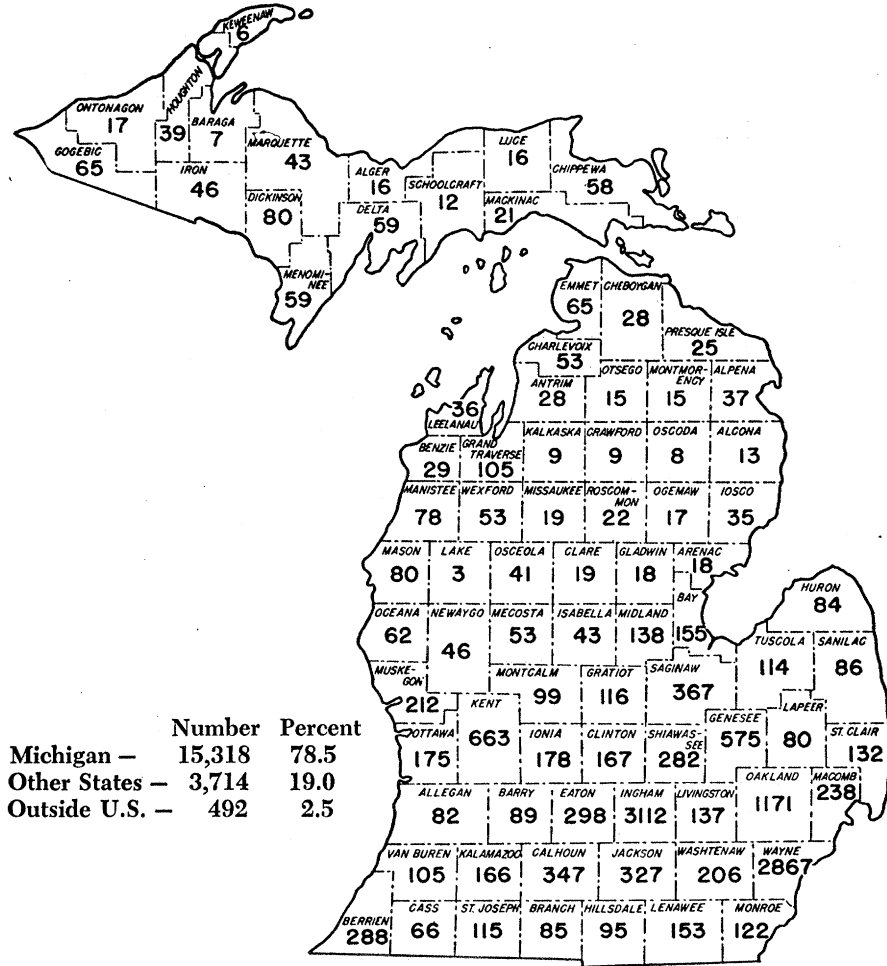

1955-1956



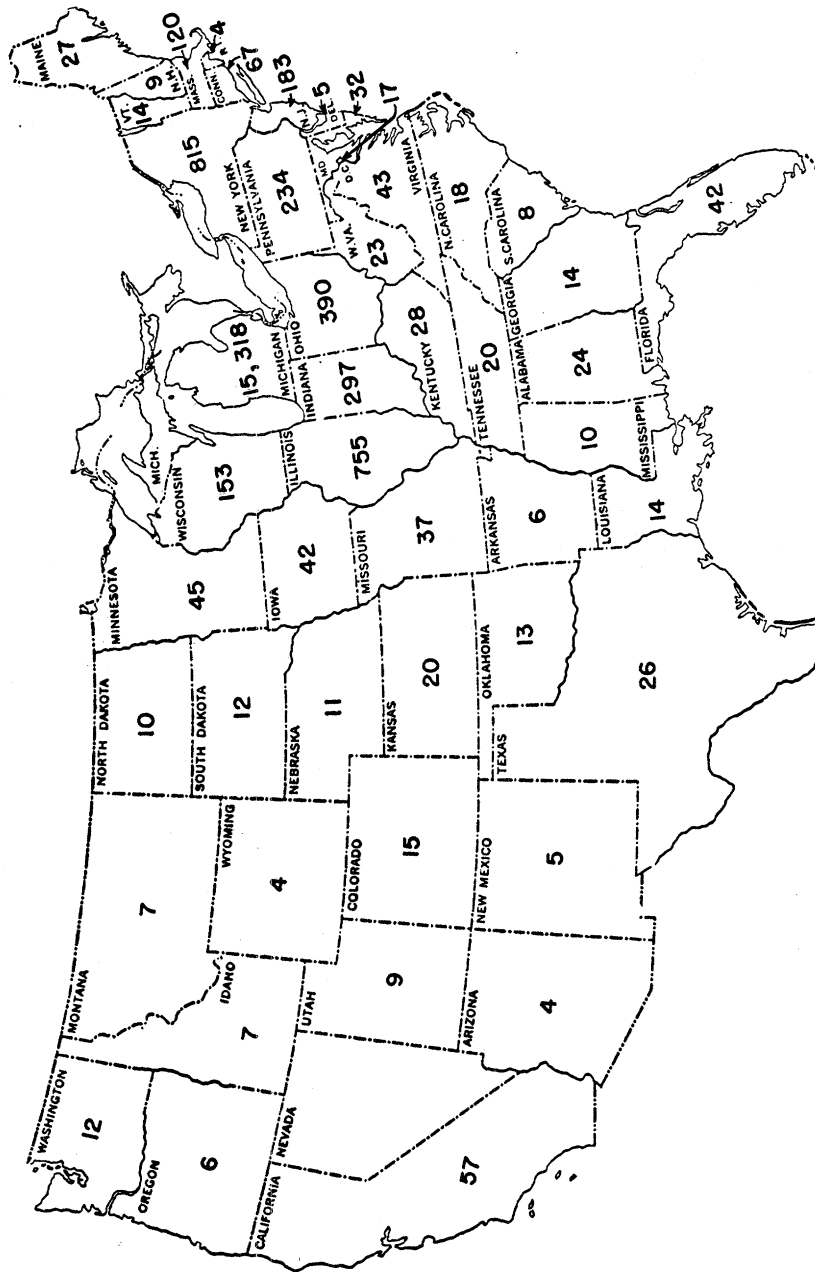


CHART IIg-2

## PART III

## NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENTS

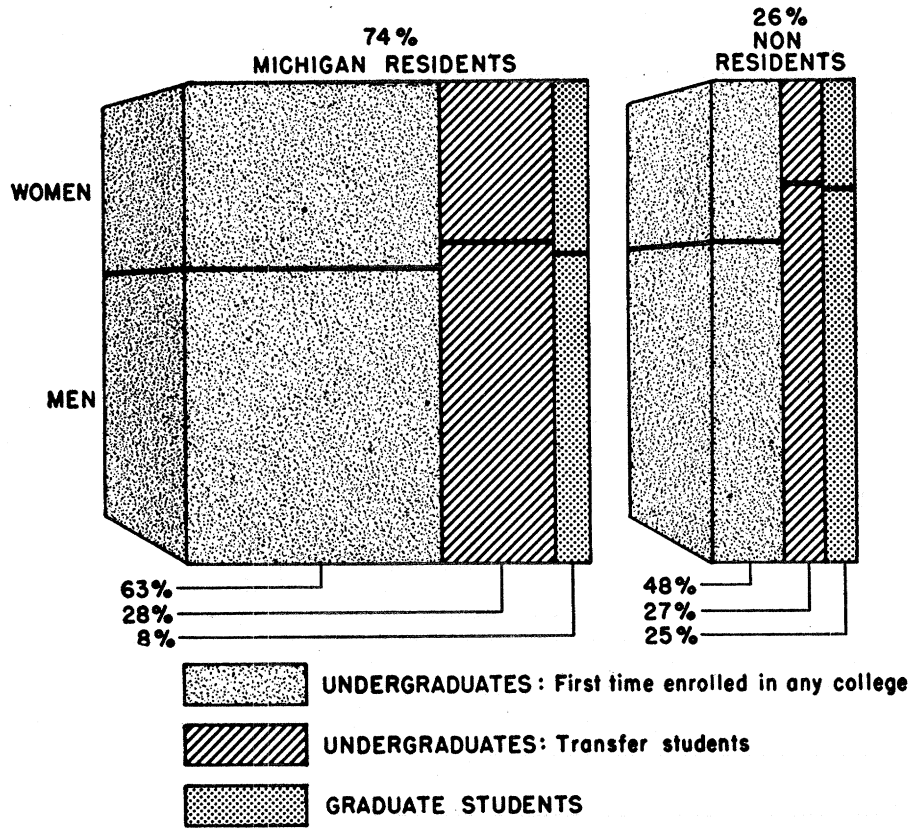

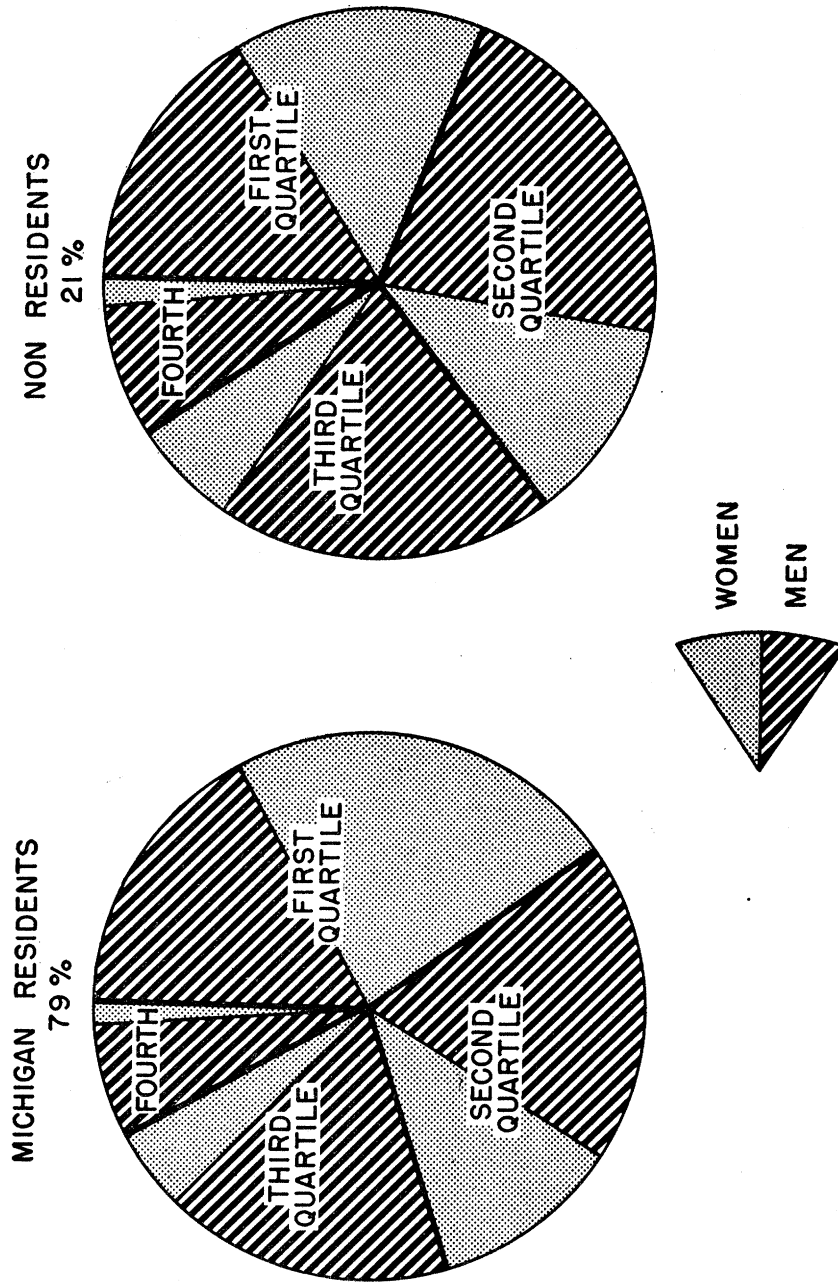

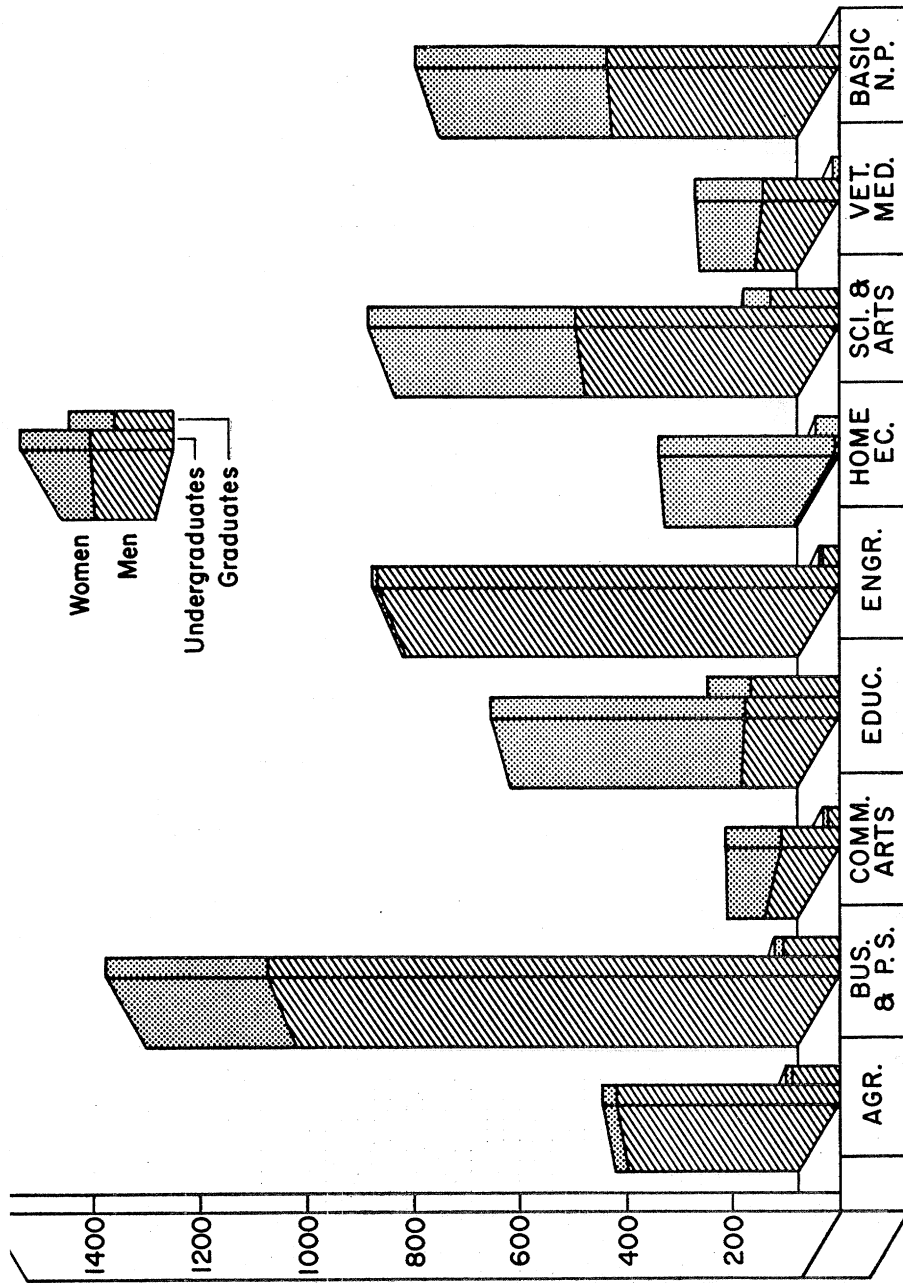

## PART IV

## DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES GRANTED

The tables and charts in this part show the rapid increase in the number of degrees granted in the last few years.

It is interesting to note that:

- (a) More degrees were granted this year that were granted from 1861 through 1916.
- (b) More graduate degrees were granted this year than were granted through 1932.
- (c) One half of all of the undergraduate degrees granted by Michigan State have been granted in the last seven years.
- (d) One half of all of the graduate degrees granted by Michigan State have been granted in the last six years; 75 per cent have been given in the last 10 years.

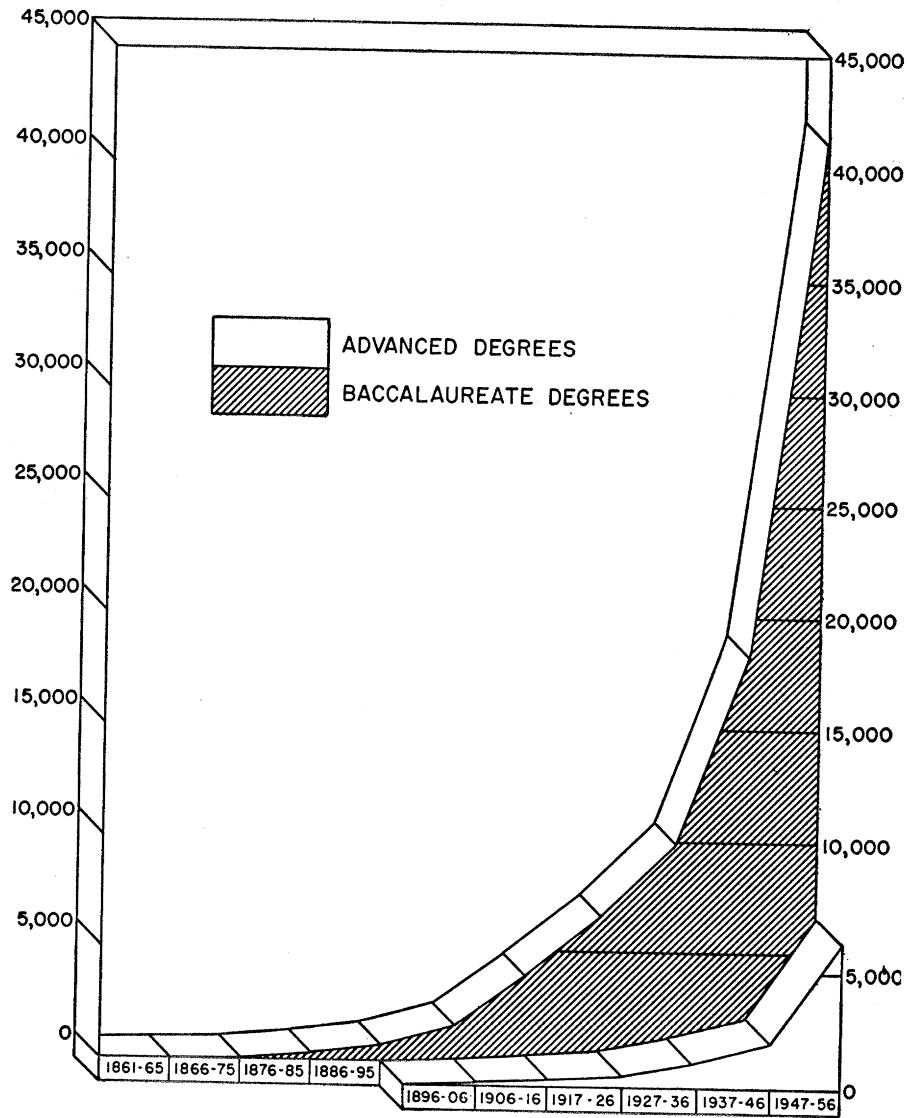


CHART IVg-1  
Degrees Conferred by Decades 1861-1956

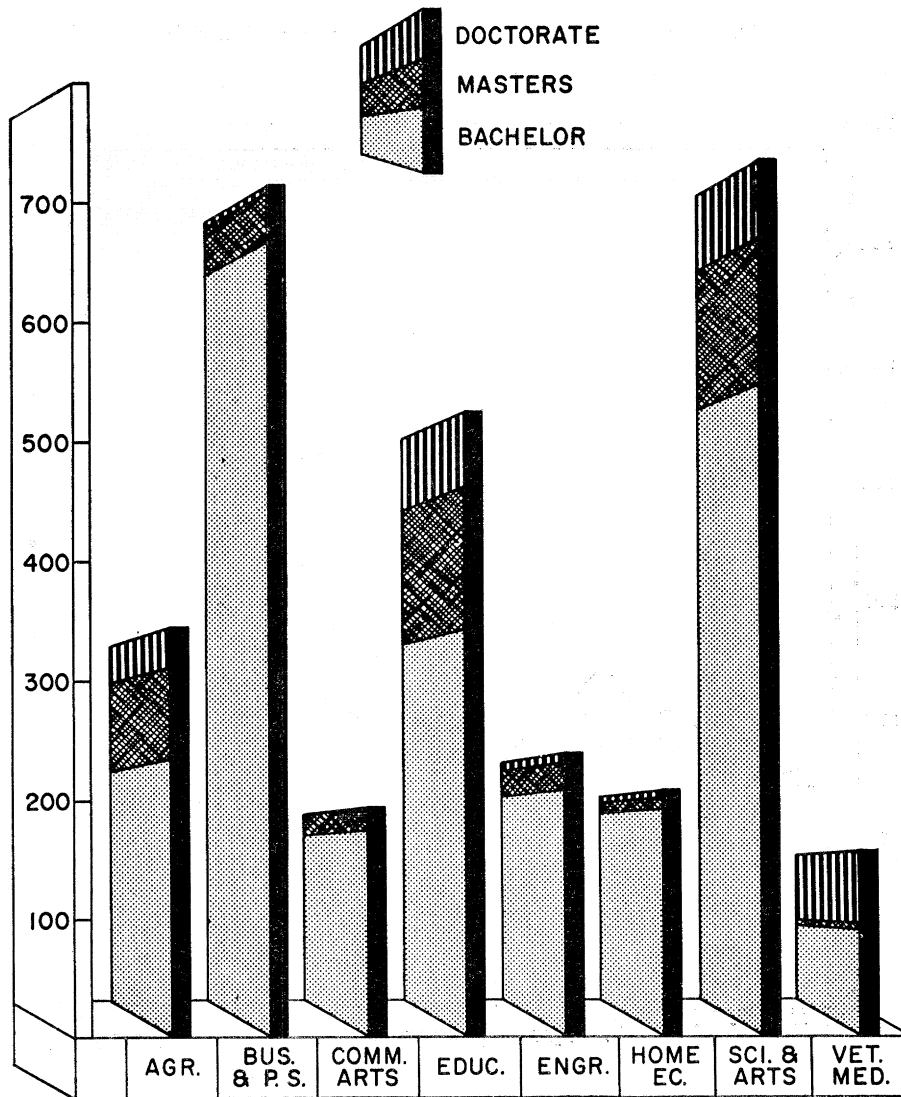


CHART IVg-2

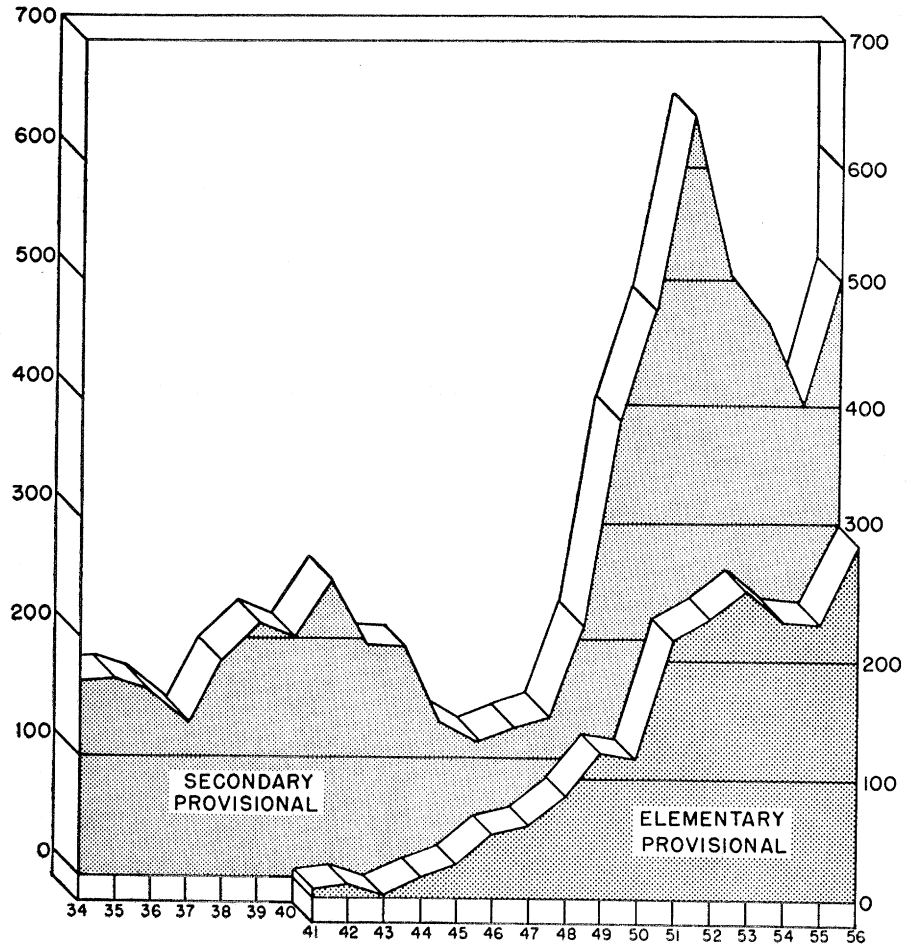
