TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENTS

Part II deals with the enrollment of all students—new and return—at Michigan State University. Chart IIa shows the growth of the University from its beginning in 1855 to the present time. Also included in this section is detailed information concerning enrollments during the past year. Table IIb and Chart IIb show the distribution of students numerically and graphically by colleges. Table IIc, d, e, and f give a further breakdown for each term by colleges and by classes. The geographical distribution of students for the past year is shown in Table IIg.

An attempt was made in past reports to show by dotted lines on Chart IIa, a prediction of future enrollments. These predictions proved to be underestimates although they were based on estimates of expected college-age students in the general population and the proportion of these students that attended college. If the present trend is significant, it seems likely that an increasingly greater percentage of college age students are entering college each year and will continue to do so in the future. With this trend in mind no attempt has been made to show on Chart IIb a predicted number of students for 1970 but merely a general trend. It is quite possible that if the present trend of a doubling of enrollments each decade continues, then by 1975 Michigan State University will enroll more than 40,000 students.

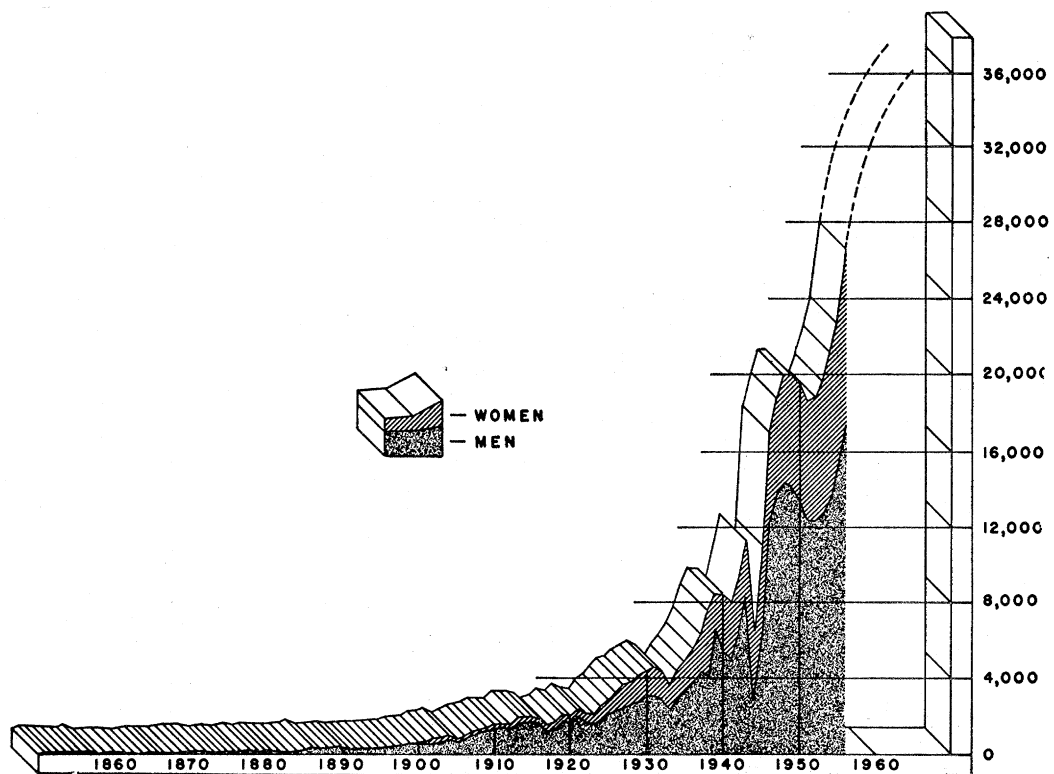

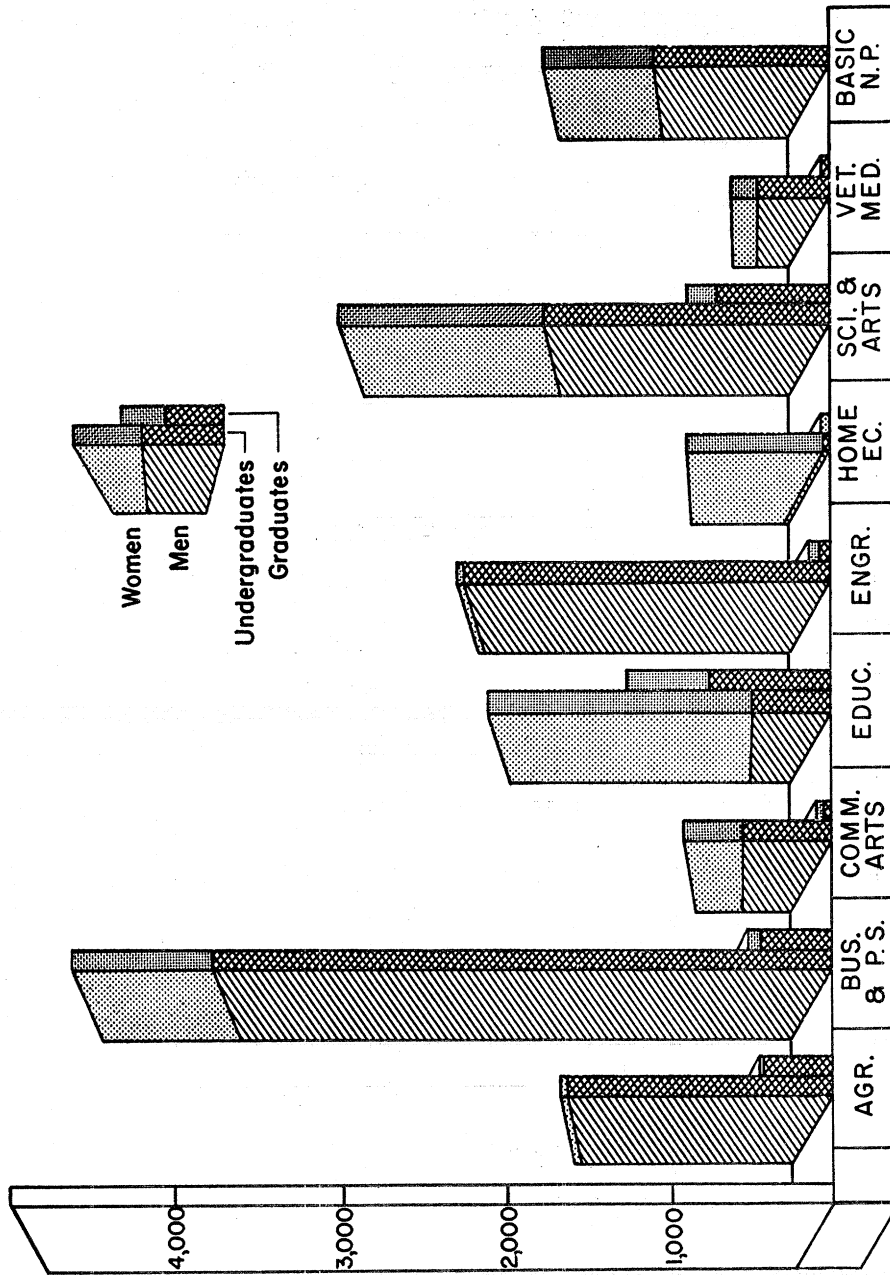


Chart IIb

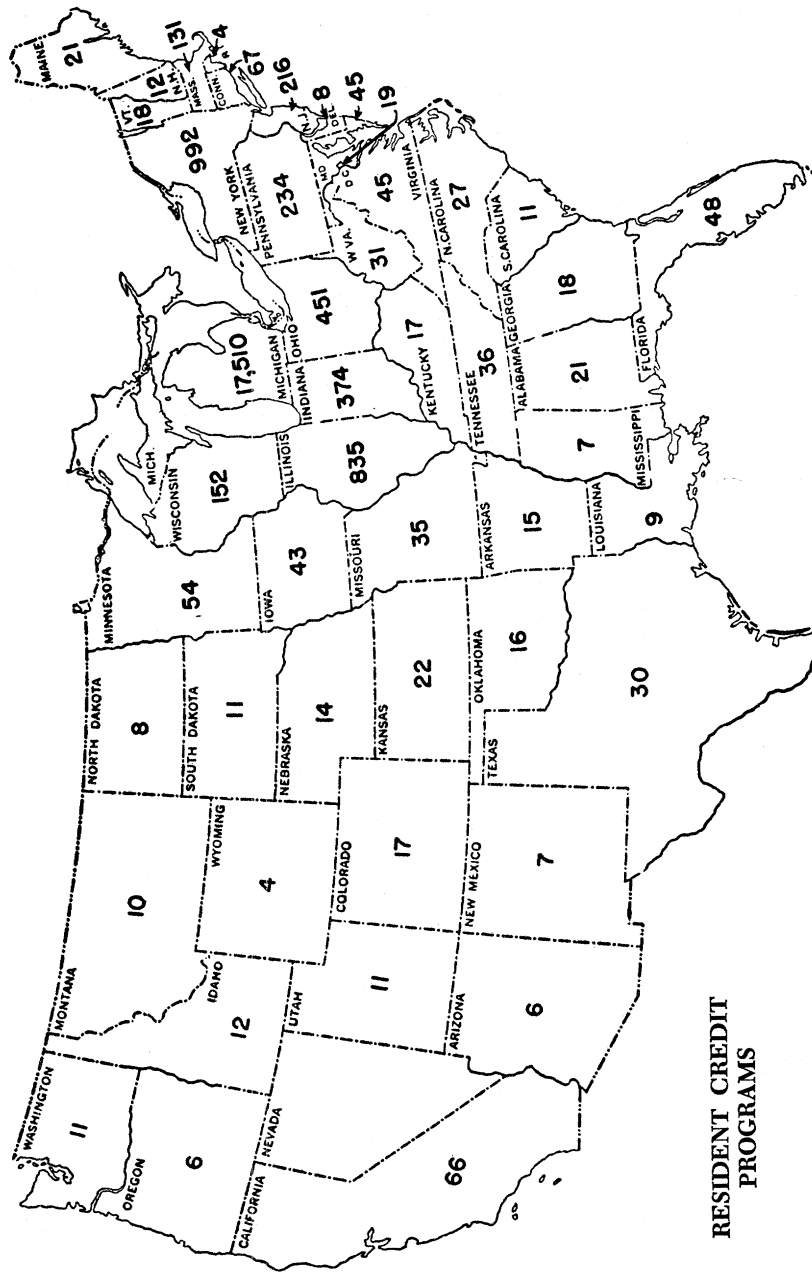

PART III

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENTS

This part of the report presents data about new students admitted to Michigan State University during the past year. The tables and charts on the following pages contain data about new students as to term of admission, type of admission, residence status, and rank in high school graduating class.

Admissions in 1956-57 showed an increase of approximately 16 per cent over the year 1955-56. If this same rate of increase holds, it can be expected that about 9000 new students will be applying for admission during the year 1957-58. More than 75 per cent of the Michigan students enrolled for the first time in any college were from the upper 50 per cent of their high school graduating class and 70 per cent of the non-resident first time students were in upper half of the senior class.

The graduate school showed the greatest increase with a gain of 25 per cent during the past year. The under-graduate increase was approximately 13 per cent.

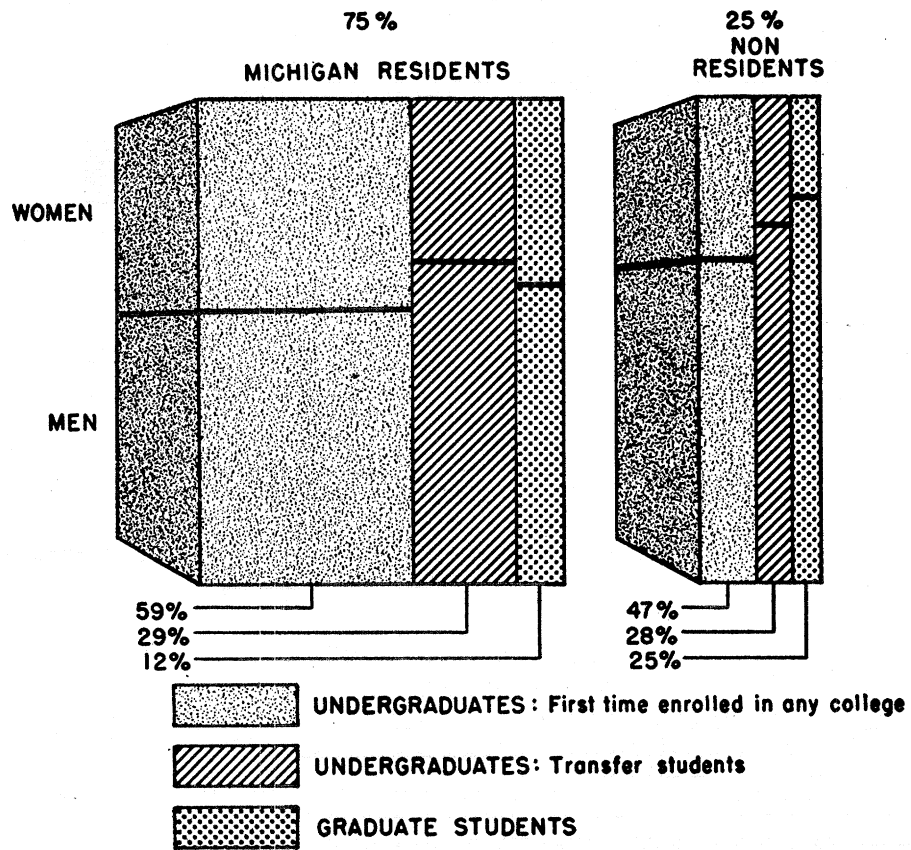

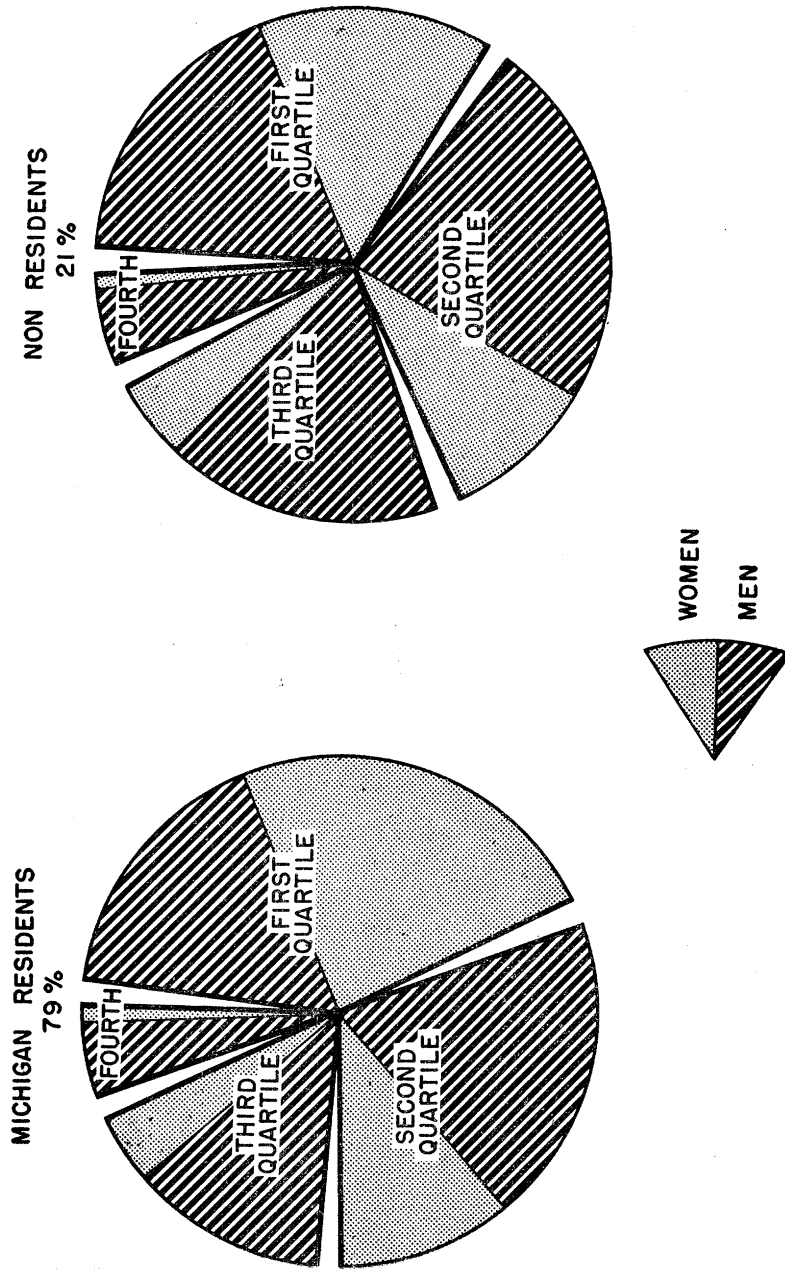

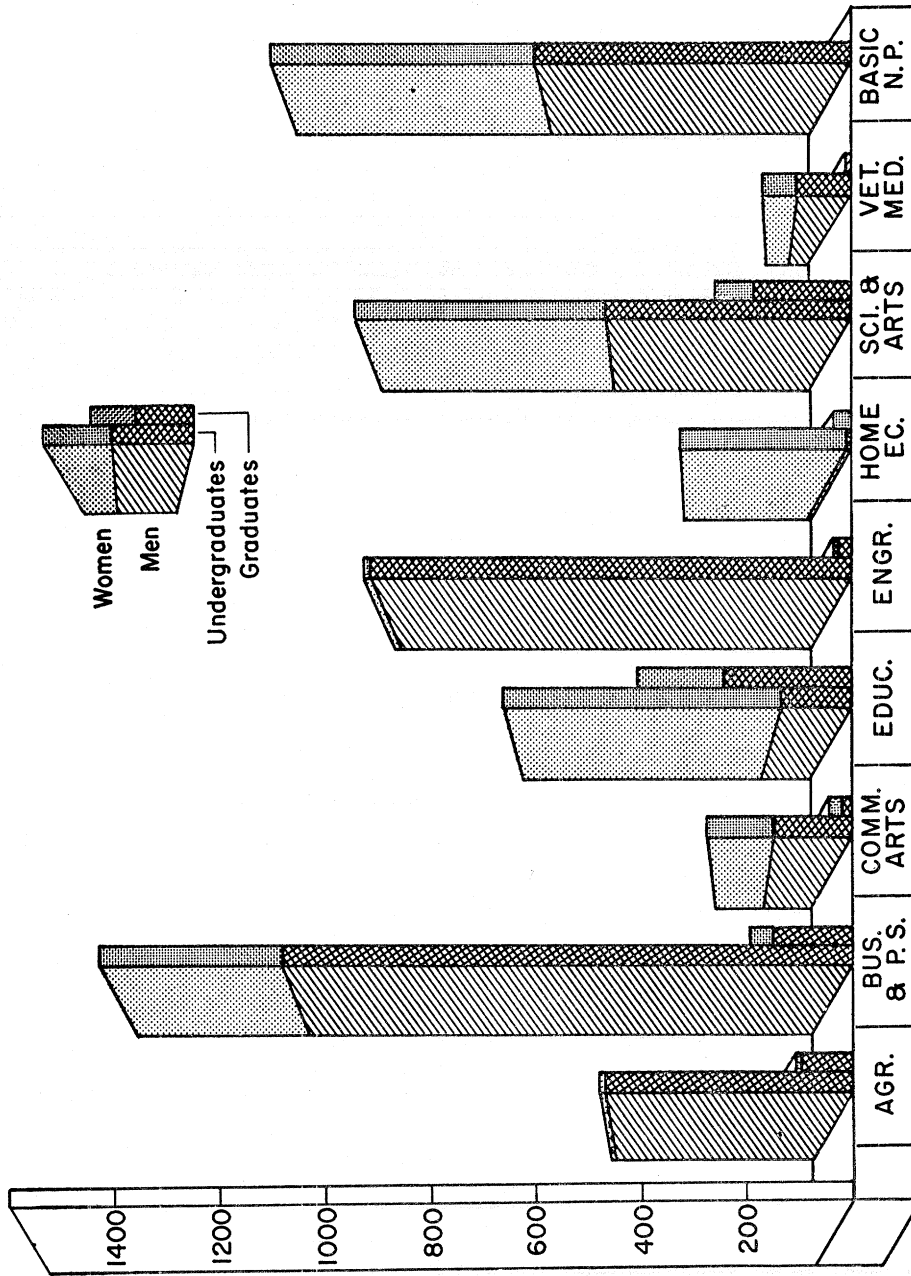

PART IV

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES GRANTED

This part of the annual report deals with the certificates and degrees conferred by Michigan State University since its beginning.

The tables and charts give a detailed distribution of degrees and certificates conferred during the past year.

A total of 3744 degrees were granted this year as compared to 3057 last year, an increase of about 22 per cent. The undergraduate degrees showed an increase of about 11 per cent and the graduate degrees a gain of about 39 per cent over a year ago. The teaching certificates show an increase of 24 per cent over the past year.

More degrees were granted during this past year than were granted from 1861 through 1920.

Chart IVg-3 shows the distribution, by colleges, of degrees conferred in 1956-57, and Charts IVg-1 and 2 show the Baccalaureate and Advanced degrees granted, by years, since the founding of the University.

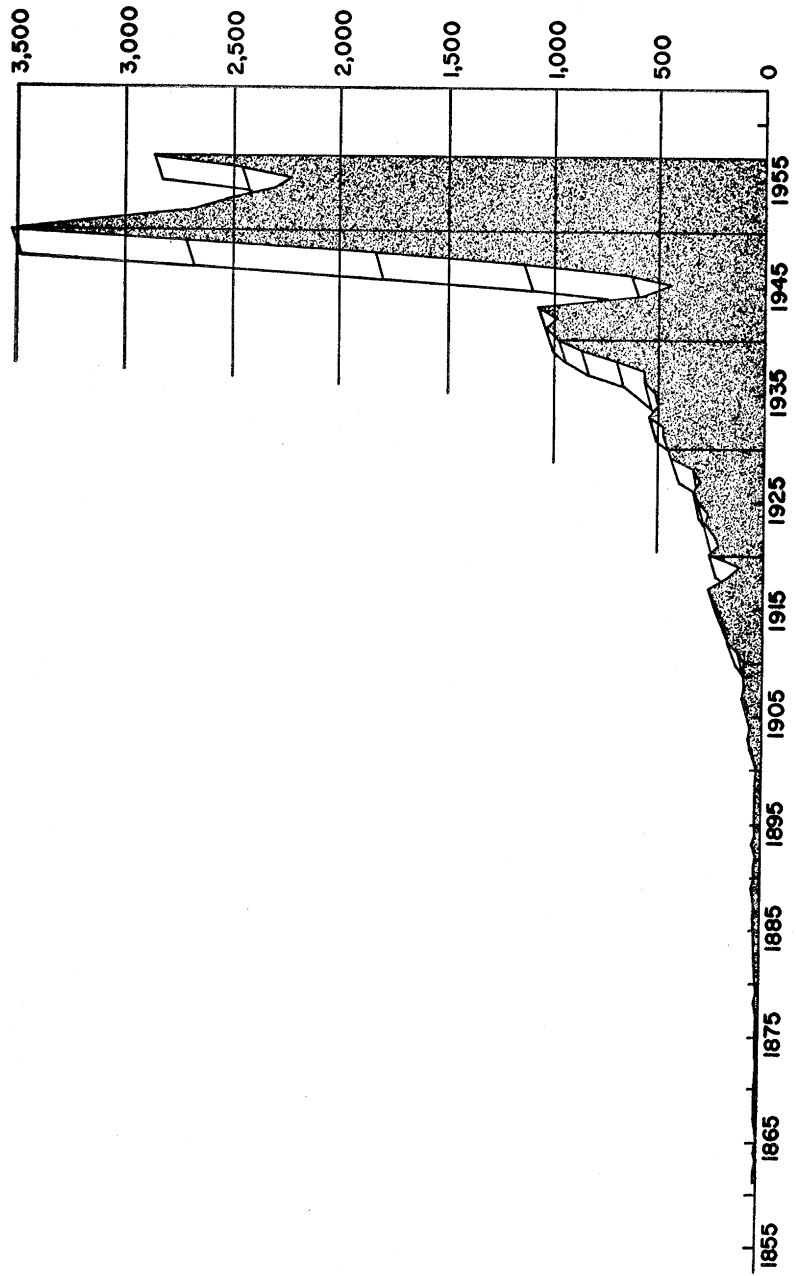

Baccalaureate Degrees Conferred by Years, 1860-1957

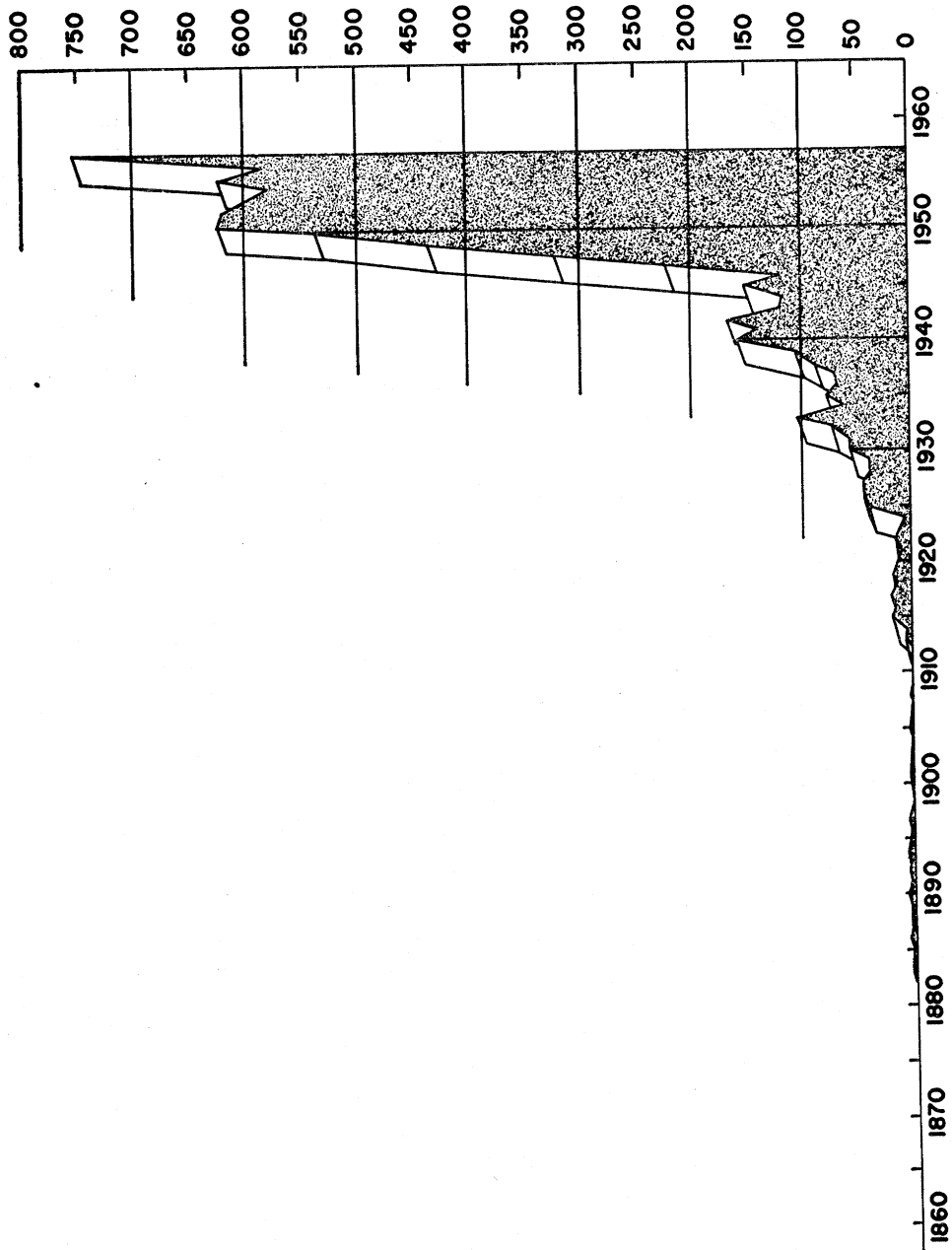

(No advanced degrees were conferred prior to 1883)

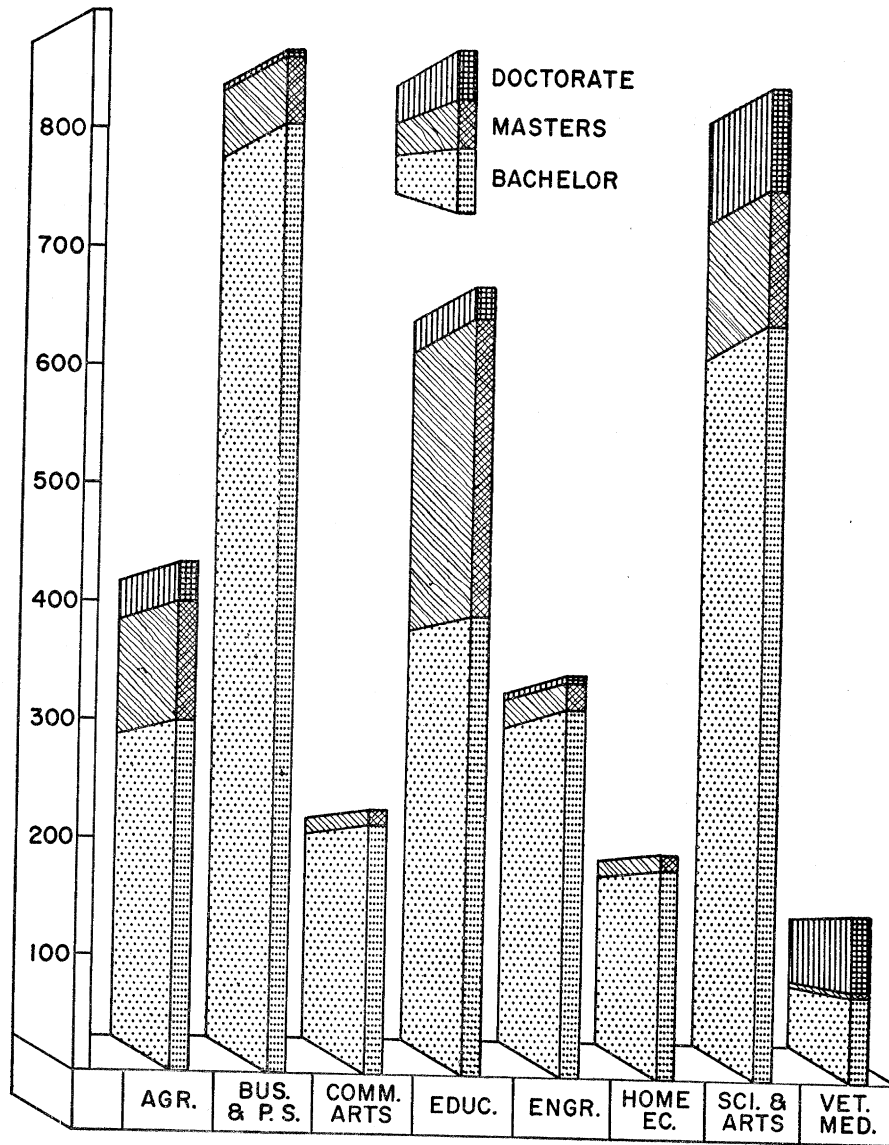

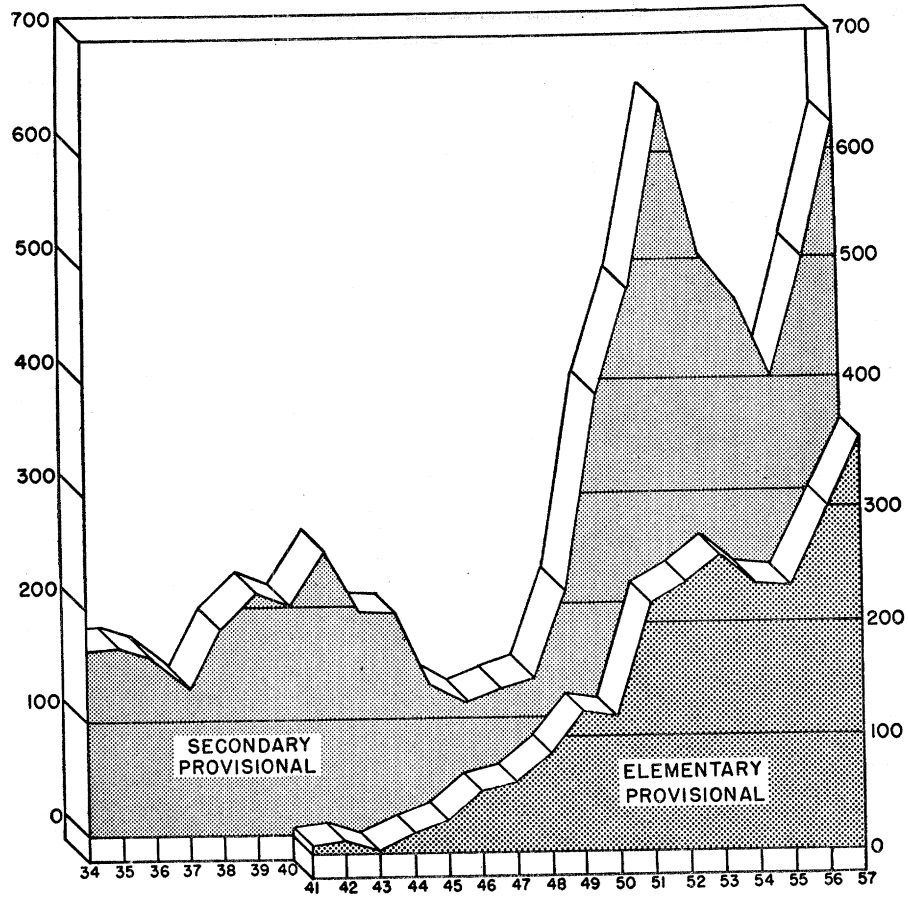
