## Other academic information:

Four semesters of German, or the equivalent, are required for acceptance into this program. During the winter and summer semesters, students can enroll in a combination of specially designed program courses and regular university courses. Program courses in German grammar and composition are available. The program also offers a small number of specially designed courses, taught in German. Students with advanced language skills may choose to take most of their courses at the regular German university, or they may opt to take a combination of university and program courses. All regular university classes are conducted in German. Past students have benefited from being in classes with German students and have taken more than 150 courses in 26 different departments, including art, anthropology, economics, German, history, international relations, mathematics, physics, and political science.

The program begins in early September with a month-long orientation that grants three (3) credits. The focus of the orientation course is intensive language acquisition and a broad cultural introduction to the region along with preparation for study at a German university. The German academic year begins in mid-October and ends in mid-July. Students are required to enroll in a minimum of 12 credits per semester (not counting the orientation course).
